### Going Digital: The Questions to Ask?

Rami moved to Nebraska in 1986 from Vancouver, British Columbia. Prior to moving from Canada, he managed photographic retail businesses for around 20 years.

In 1988 he purchased a small studio in Seward. Today the studio has expanded in both size and services to become a full service photographic studio and framing gallery. The retail area is approximately 4,000 square feet and the camera room is about 1200 square feet. The studio includes a full color lab as well as a black and white lab. Restoration and straight copy work has been the backbone of his business. Rami's Photography and Digital Imaging is also digital service bureau for studios/individuals who do not have high quality input and output devices. Images can be sent in either a zip drive or CD format.

When the Digital Revolution Bug caught up with Rami in the fall of 1996, he jumped in with both feet. He continues to shoot traditionally with film and then inputs the negative into the computer. His digital system operates on a Macintosh platform with dual monitors, flatbed scanner, Kodak 3570 Film scanner, LaserGraphics 6x7 film recorder, Fuji Pictograph 3000 digital printer, zip drive and CD writer storage devices. With this equipment, he can either output im-

ages directly to a digital print or produce negatives which are then printed traditionally. The studio work is divided evenly between these two printing methods.

While there are a lot of people giving programs on Digital, the information that Rami has to share is different. His program is geared toward people considering getting into

> Digital, but don't know the right questions to ask. Rami is the voice of experience. He wants to prevent you from making the same mistakes he did which resulted in spending extra money and suffering needless frustrations. He will talk about hardware, software, input, and output devices. There will also be information about how his business has changed since "going digital".

In the past, he has given programs on archival quality copy and restoration work as well as on framing. Rami's studio also offers small hands-on classes on his digital equipment and one-on-one teaching programs on Adobe Photoshop. Rami earned his C.P.P.

(Certified Professional Photographer) in 1994.
