TOM GOC'S PROGRAM

Review by Steve Miller

With the sudden and unexpected change in meeting locations, Tom Goc had an excellent opportunity to excel and show us PPGO photographers how to put on a program. With the program on Black & White studio promotions. Tom explained why B&W is returning in style, not so much as something different, yet a highly fashionable way to decorate. Dealing with several versions, such as:

"Etchings, on heavy fibre paper, that creates the look of pencil etchings."

"Vignettes, high key images that accentuate the subject, not the environment are printed on a heavy fibre paper for archival quality.

"Hand colored images, are black & white photographs on which a n artist carefully blends color back into the image."

Flavors, where the image remains predominantly b&w and color is added to accentuate certain details."

"Antique oil, goes back to the days prior to color paper, where the artist actually colorized the entire image to make a realistic impression of a color photograph.

A fine presentation on how Goc's Photography in Columbus markets these styles. It does involve some darkroom time, and isn't this what it use to be about. Seems we all get to busy just existing, yet Tom has rediscovered some of the magic I remember in doing B&W printing.

Murphy's Laws of Wedding Photography

- If you agree to shoot a discount package for a certain date, you will receive 6 other calls for the same date, including two from celebrities, and one from the Clintons asking you to cover Chelsea's secret ceremony.
- 2. If it's a 30 minute drive to the location and you give yourself an hour, you will arrive 30 minutes early, but if you give yourself 30 minutes, you will arrive 15 minutes late.
- 3. If you pack 20 rolls of film, you will use 10. If you pack 10 rolls of film, you will need 20.
- 4. If the bride is on time....the groom will be late. If the groom is on time...the bride will be late. If they're both on time.....you will be late.
- 5. The amount of time the bride is late is directly proportional to the amount of time you were early.
- Mothers of the bride will offer no input regarding what should be photographed until after the proofs are delivered.
- 7. If you shoot with 35 mm, the bride will have been told to make sure it's medium format. If you shoot with medium format she will have been told to make sure it's a Hasselblad. If you shoot with a Hasselblad...she won't care.
- 8. If you have Saturday and Sunday, back to back weddings, the Saturday reception will end at 2:30 am and the Sunday ceremony will start at 9 am.






